WHAT WE SET OUT TO DO

PRIMARY GOAL

100% ENGAGEMENT

We set out as a church family to grow our faith as we fully engaged in the Uncharted Initiative, asking God to give us greater faith for a greater future. Our hope is that this faith initiative helps people take steps in their personal faith journey.

SECONDARY GOAL

\$12 MILLION

(our goal from last year)

The secondary goal represented all that was needed to carry out the mission of Grace daily as we seek to meet the needs of our communities, create weekly environments where people can experience God's love personally, and make room for those who aren't here yet.

Uncharted Ministry: \$6 million (our goal from last year) for the lifeblood of what we do daily – our annual ministry budget.

Uncharted Expansion: \$6 million (our goal from last year) to expand our Grace Kids ministry, improve security for our Grace Kids ministry, and minimize ministry barriers by re-configuring space for the Grace Students ministry.



WHAT GOD HAS DONE

Over the past year, God has continued to grow our impact as a church. In fact, from January through May of this year - we saw **our church grow more than 40% in attendance from the previous time period last year**. That growth was matched in our Grace Kids ministry and has only continued throughout the summer.

With that growth, we have also seen:

WHERE WE ARE GOING

When we set out on the original Uncharted journey in the fall of 2022, we decided at the time that we would need to approach this project in 2 phases so that we could build each space to meet the needs of future growth. The first need we would address would be more space for Grace Kids ministry, then address the need to create more room for people in a larger auditorium.

As we began to assess the growth pattern and evaluate our building plans, it became clear that we needed to find a way to get to the next phase faster. We went back to the builder, who was able to find a way to reduce the cost of the second phase while still getting us all the space we needed to make room for more people.

In fact, **we believe that with the growth we have seen, the generosity of this church, and God's power at work here,** we are in a position to begin the process of moving toward the next phase right away. Meaning, we are asking God to give us all that is needed to make space for those he has put us here to reach by building a larger auditorium and expanding the common space in our lobby to support the growth.

Uncharted is not going away! Uncharted is here to stay! But instead of Uncharted simply being a two-year initiative that was launched in the fall of 2022 and was set to go two years through the fall of 2024, **we are expanding our Uncharted journey by launching a NEW two-year initiative that will launch this fall of 2023 and go through the fall of 2025. We're calling this new initiative: Uncharted: New Horizons.**

NEW HORIZONS

PRIMARY GOAL

100% ENGAGEMENT

We want to continue as a church family to grow our faith as we fully engage in this initiative, asking God to give us eyes to see New Horizons and faith beyond what we can currently see. Our hope is that each of us would take steps of faith and generosity that would please and honor God and grow us each as disciples in him.



SECONDARY GOAL

\$18 MILLION

The secondary goal represents mission advancement, and there are two components of it:

UNCHARTED MINISTRY: \$7 MILLION

for the lifeblood of what we do daily - our annual ministry budget for the next two years.

UNCHARTED EXPANSION: \$11 MILLION*

to expand our Grace Kids ministry, improve security for our Grace Kids ministry, renovate space in the main building for our Grace Students ministry, expand our common space in our lobby, and build a new auditorium for the growth of Grace.

*\$11 million will be contributed towards the total project cost of Phase 1 (kids and students space) and Phase 2 (lobby and auditorium space); and the remainder of the project cost will be covered through responsible financing which has already been approved.

The Journey of a Giver

INITIAL GIVER

An Initial Giver decides to give for the first time out of a response to God's Word. This is someone who decides to give something and trust God and the leaders of the Church with this gift.

CONSISTENT GIVER

A Consistent Giver decides to give something consistently to exercise the discipline of giving regularly. Often, someone who makes their gift an online recurring gift will learn the behavior of consistency. Non-online givers can be consistent givers as well; it just requires more discipline.

INTENTIONAL GIVER

An Intentional Giver begins to think about their giving in relation to other things on which they spend their money. For example, this type of giver begins asking the question, "Why am I giving more to AT&T than I am giving to God? Should I be giving to God more than I give for my mortgage each month?" This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they prioritize and spend their money. This may be the point of intentionality when someone begins to tithe, reflecting intentionality about a certain amount/percentage they want to give to God.

LIFETIME GIVER

A Lifetime Giver thinks about the long-term effects of generosity rather than month-to-month generosity or even year-to-year. They make short-term decisions that may have long-term effects as it relates to their generosity capacity. A Lifetime Giver might be someone who has a giving goal that governs their larger-ticket decisions. They make lifetime or longer-term giving commitments that govern his/her larger-item purchases like homes, cars, investments, etc...

SURRENDERED GIVER

A Surrendered Giver recognizes the cost Christ paid on the cross for us and is surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. They give in a way that changes them. Their giving determines their spending/saving rather than their spending/saving determining their giving. A Surrendered Giver isn't concerned with what they ARE giving but more concerned with what they're NOT giving and why. They seek to honor God with 100% of what he has given them, whether direct monetary giving or a God-honoring use of an existing resource like a home or a vehicle.

PASSIONATELY & PERSISTENTLY

Ask God to work in the hearts of everyone at Grace Fellowship and give us a passion for seeking his Kingdom first, above all else. To awaken a diverse community to Jesus. Pray that he would make clear the next step he is asking each of us to take in our discipleship journey.

COMMIT

FULLY & FAITHFULLY

Commit fully to help us reach our goal of 100% engagement and simply commit to all that God asks of you.

GIVE

GENEROUSLY, CHEERFULLY, EXPECTANTLY

Give expectantly, in a way that stretches you to a deeper level of generosity. Give expecting that God will do a powerful work in you as you become more like him.

One Fund Explanation

ONE MISSION. ONE FUND.

A traditional capital campaign focuses mostly on people who are already giving. These people are asked to continue giving what they currently are, as well as to start giving toward something else...like a building or special project. That isn't what the Uncharted: New Horizons Initiative is. Instead, Uncharted will be a "one fund" initiative, meaning ALL of our giving goes toward carrying out the mission and expansion of the ministry space over the next two years. It's all one mission, so it's all one budget.


Why does this distinction matter?

We want everyone at Grace to be transformed through the Uncharted: New Horizons Initiative. Through a "one fund" initiative, we will more successfully invite everyone to take steps into uncharted territory with their generosity, regardless of whether they give or WHAT they give.

Also, God has given Grace one mission. Our general operating budget is a HUGE part of this mission, and our future facility will be a HUGE part of this mission. A traditional capital campaign can easily divide our focus in 2 ways: 1) mission and 2) the building. That can't happen. It's all one mission, so it's all one budget.

The Uncharted: New Horizons Initiative will last for two years. In those two years, every dime that is given to Grace Fellowship will go to **Uncharted to help us inspire and equip people to know and follow Jesus.**

GATHERING IS GOOD

CONNECT

What is one group, division, team, etc., that have you seen work effectively together? What were the characteristics of the group that made them effective?

LEARN

Before watching the video and discussing the questions provided, we encourage taking a few moments to pray. This is an opportunity to ask God into your conversations. Here's a simple prayer you can use to begin your time:

Heavenly Father, thank you for bringing this group together. Help us see what you would have us see through our time together. Amen

WATCH VIDEO

READ HEBREWS 10:23-25

This passage tells us we should think about how to “motivate” one another to love and do good deeds. Other translations use “spur,” “encourage,” or “stimulate.” Who is a person you know who encourages others to “love and good works”? How does that person motivate others?

What are some challenges that might keep us from meeting together in small groups or even in Sunday services? What are some ways we can encourage one another to overcome those challenges?

READ MATTHEW 18:19-20

What are your experiences of praying with others? Childhood? Present? Positive? Negative? Are you inclined towards praying together? Why is it

sometimes hard to pray with others?

Think about Chris's illustration of clapping with others and praying with others. What does this scripture and the illustration tell us about how God moves when we pray together?

READ ROMANS 12:4-5

In what ways are parts of our physical body dependent on one another? Think about specific parts like the heart and the lungs or even the foot and the eye. How does the co-dependence of the parts of the body relate to believers in the church or in a small group?

What are the consequences to the church and to individuals if we do not connect ourselves to other believers?

APPLY

How did God speak to you this week through the scripture, the video or sermon, or your discussion?

In the video, Chris shared the belief that if we are intentional about connecting with one another during this initiative, we will all grow in our faith. What is an intentional step you will take to connect with others in your group or beyond your group?

PRAY

Pray for your group and our church that we will gather together to carry out the mission of inspiring and equipping people to know and follow Jesus.

Share prayer requests, and spend time in intercession for one another.

WATCH VIDEO

WATCH VIDEO

READ MATTHEW 7:7-11

Is there a time when you have asked for something in prayer and did not receive the answer you wanted? How does this jell with the passage in Matthew?

Why does Jesus command His disciples to ask, to seek, and to knock? What do these commands imply about your heart and your dependence on God?

How are you doing at being persistent in prayer? Where do you struggle with this issue in your life? Why?

How have you discovered in your life and through the lives of others that God gives good gifts? Share your story of God's good gifts in your life. Make a list of God's gifts in your group.

If you encountered someone who wondered if God cared and if God was good, how could you share with them about this passage and your experience with God's good gifts?

APPLY

What are some practical steps you will take (or you already take) to be persistent in prayer? Prayer journals, prayer cards, phone reminders, etc.

What are some prayers that you have dropped that you want to pick up?

What are some ways you, as a group, can support one another to be persistent in prayer?

PRAY

Pray that God will give us all the space we need to minister to all that he is bringing to the church.

Ask God to show each person in the group how he wants you to be a part of the Uncharted, New Horizons initiative.

Share prayer requests, especially those where you want to be persistent, and spend time in intercession for one another.

BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING

CONNECT

What's one possession or tool that enhances your daily life?

What's one thing that you have too many of?

LEARN

Before watching the video and discussing the questions provided, we encourage you to take a few moments to pray that God will guide your conversations and thoughts.

WATCH VIDEO

READ LUKE 12:13-21

What did the person in the crowd want Jesus to do, and what does this reveal about the man's heart? What do our own struggles with greed vs. generosity say about our hearts?

What warning did Jesus give in verse 15? What is greed, and what does "all kinds of greed" suggest? What deception that accompanies greed did Jesus expose?

FAQS

How long is my commitment? We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment to the Uncharted Initiative. The fulfillment period for your commitment will begin in December 2023 and culminate in December 2025.

Why are we doing a brand new two-year initiative?

Why didn't we just add an extra year onto our current Uncharted Initiative? As much as we have grown as a church, we have hundreds of households who have joined us since we began Uncharted last fall. Instead of making them feel like they are joining halfway through a party that has already been happening for a year, we instead wanted to bring the party supplies over from that party and start a brand NEW party FRESH so that everyone can feel a part of it from the beginning. This doesn't negate whatsoever the generosity that has already occurred over this last year. Uncharted has been so wildly successful that we wouldn't be where we are without the strong generosity from givers from the first year! But the need is so significant for what it will take to expand our worship facility and make room for those whom God is sending to us that we need everyone to be a part of it! Thanks for jumping in and joining the new party across the street!

What are you asking me to do? First and foremost, we ask that you pray and seek God's guidance on what he asks of you. Prepare your heart to hear him and listen to what he says. Join a group this season if you aren't already part of one. Engage in personal reflection with God in the Uncharted Guide you receive. Talk with your spouse, your family, or others about what this commitment will mean for this next exciting season of your life. We ask that you make a surrendered commitment to generosity – whatever God leads you to do. Follow him. Finally, we ask that you prepare to be amazed. We serve an awesome God, and he will move in remarkable ways. We anticipate an unprecedented impact from our collective Uncharted commitments – something only God can do. Please mark your calendar for Commitment Sunday, November 13, 2023, and prepare to experience a life-changing worship service that will be remembered as a defining moment for our church and faith.

Are there additional ways besides finances that I can give more toward the Uncharted Initiative?

Be creative as you explore ways you and your family can give. You might have some stock, property, or other items. Or you may have some stored resources that God has blessed you with in the past that he might call you to give during this time. What if I don't have a job right now? What does that mean for my Uncharted Initiative commitment?

The Uncharted Initiative is about your total, radical, and sacrificial generosity for Grace Fellowship Church. We believe that God calls us to action in times of hardship just as much as he does in time of abundance, which looks different for every person. But the Uncharted Initiative is about a heart change, accomplished by surrendering our lives completely. That may mean that you are challenged to sell things, pick up odd jobs, or even trust God in faith by making a commitment that you don't quite know how to fulfill right now but that you believe God will provide for as you seek ways to sacrifice and work toward that commitment. We would like everyone to be a part of the Uncharted Initiative so that we can all be supporting, loving, encouraging, and praying for one another through this spiritually-transforming season at Grace.

What if I am severely in debt? Am I supposed to give?

If you are currently seeking to pay off debt, we commend you for that. And you should continue to do so. We would be happy to help you on that journey and recommend a budgeting group and resources that might help you. Being in debt, however, does not have to prevent someone from giving. Giving isn't about what God wants from you; it's about what God wants for you. So it can be our joy and privilege to give at all times. What if I have never given to Grace before?

The Uncharted Initiative was explicitly designed with you in mind. Uncharted is a "one fund" generosity initiative, meaning that it is different from a traditional capital campaign where you are called to not only regularly give to the church's general fund but also asked to give to a special project or building fund – creating TWO steps for people who aren't yet giving. By doing a "one fund" initiative with Uncharted, we're saying that every dime given to Grace over the next two years goes towards Uncharted. You don't need to be a regular giver already to participate. Uncharted is a call to sacrificial, gospel-centered generosity for everyone at Grace. If you have never given, this is your chance to get in the game and commit to God's work. We hope you will.

What if I am new to Grace? Uncharted is about the vision of our church. We believe that the local church is one of the most compelling missions to give toward, and would love for you to make Grace your church. If you are ready for it, this is a perfect time to put a stake in the ground and make this your church.
